

Walk miles of trails through rolling woodlands and enjoy the diversity of nature at Chapin Forest.

Have a half-hour to spend? Try one of the following:

Relax and watch for birds, squirrels, chipmunks – and more! – at any of the four picnic areas.

Walk from Twin Ponds Shelter along Ruffed Grouse Trail, returning along Ash Grove Link.

Hike from Ledges Shelter along Lucky Stone Loop, returning along Wintergreen Link.

Have an hour to spend? Try one of the following:

Explore Lucky Stone Loop from Ledges Shelter, returning along Mourning Cloak Link.

Stroll from Quarry Pond Shelter or Forest Shelter along Quarry Pond Loop, returning along Chapin Parkway.

- Hike from Twin Ponds parking lot along the Parcourse Trail.
- Walk from Twin Ponds Shelter along Ruffed Grouse Trail, returning along Arbor Lane.

Have two hours to spend? Try one of the following:

• Hike from Ledges Shelter along Lucky Stone Loop, Arbor Lane and Ruffed Grouse Trail.

• Walk from Twin Ponds parking lot along Arbor Lane and Lucky Stone Loop.

• Visit Quarry Pond, the scenic overlook on Lucky Stone Loop and the ponds at Twin Ponds.

Enjoy these other activities at Chapin Forest:

• Fish for bass, catfish and pan fish with friends and family at Twin Ponds (fishing license required).

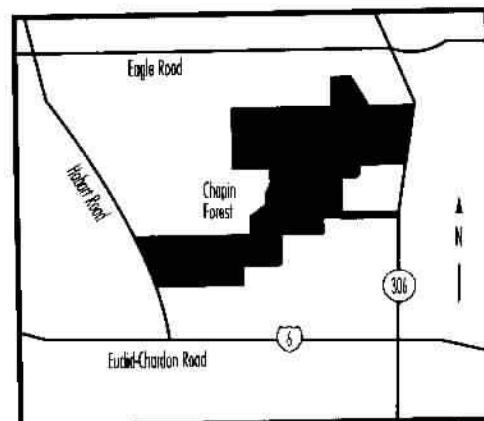
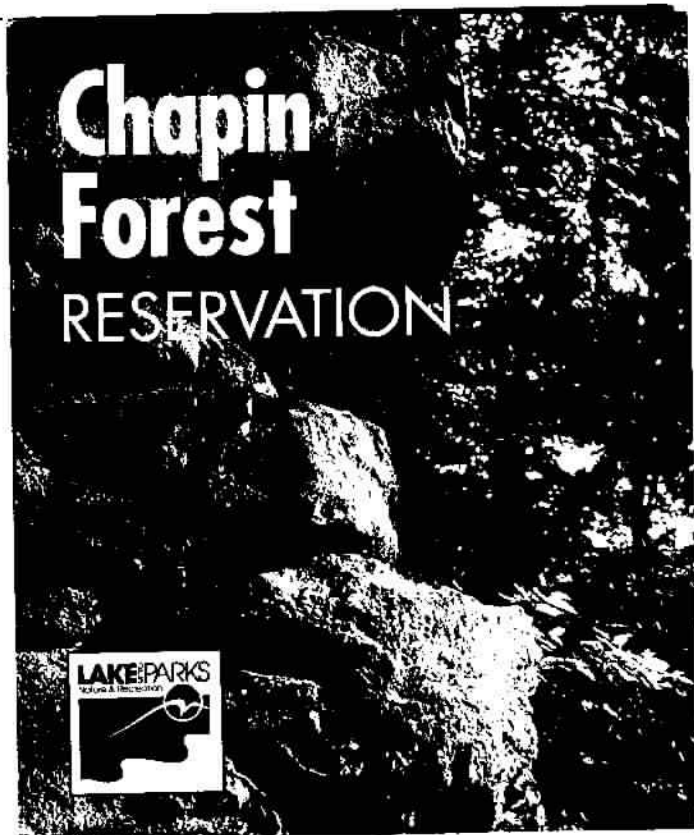
• Grab the binoculars and a field guide to go bird watching.

Pack a picnic, relax and watch for wildlife at any of the four picnic areas.

• Get in shape! Exercise in any weather at the outdoor Parcourse Trail which features 20 exercise stations along its route.

Stop in early or late in the day to catch a glimpse of wildlife – white-tailed deer, flying squirrels, red fox and barred owls.

• Go cross-country skiing or try snowshoes! Rentals are available at Pine Lodge. Call for information on learning to cross-country ski or snowshoe.



From I-90 or Route 2, follow 306 south:

- The Parkway to Quarry Pond Shelter, Forest Shelter and Ledges Shelter is off Route 306, three and one-half miles south of I-90 in Kirtland.
- Twin Ponds Shelter and Pine Lodge are on Hobart Road, north off Route 6, one mile west of Route 306 in Kirtland.
